SLIDE 4

Definition: Devotion

Websters 1828:

A solemn attention to the Supreme Being in worship; a yielding of the heart and affections to God, with reverence, faith and piety, in religious duties, particularly in prayer and meditation; devoutness.

profound dedication, a form of prayer or worship

SLIDE 5

1 Corinthians 7:35 - I am saying this for your benefit, not to place restrictions on you. I want you to do whatever will help you serve the Lord best, with as few distractions as possible.

SLIDE 6

PURPOSE: TRANSFORMATION:

transform

(Gk. *metamorphoō*) (12:2; Matt. 17:2; 2 Cor. 3:18) Strong's #3339: The Greek word means "to change form," as does the English derivative *metamorphosis*. In the New Testament, this word is used to describe an inward renewal of our mind through which our inner spirit is changed into the likeness of Christ. Paul told the Roman believers: "Be transformed by the renewing of your minds" (12:2). As our Christian life progresses, we should gradually notice that our thought life is being changed from Christlessness to Christlikeness. Transformation does not happen overnight. Our regeneration is instantaneous, but our transformation is continuous. We are conformed to Christ's image gradually as we spend time in intimate fellowship with Him (see 2 Cor. 3:18).¹

Exodus 34:29-35

The Shining Face of Moses

²⁹ Now it was so, when Moses came down from Mount Sinai (and the two tablets of the Testimony *were* in Moses' hand when he came down from the mountain), that Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone while he talked with Him.

³⁰ So when Aaron and all the children of Israel saw Moses, behold, the skin of his face shone, and they were afraid to come near him.

³¹Then Moses called to them, and Aaron and all the rulers of the congregation returned to him; and Moses talked with them.

³² Afterward all the children of Israel came near, and he gave them as commandments all that the LORD had spoken with him on Mount Sinai.

³³ And when Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face.

³⁴ But whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with Him, he would take the veil off until he came out; and he would come out and speak to the children of Israel whatever he had been commanded.

³⁵ And whenever the children of Israel saw the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses' face shone, then Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with Him.²

SLIDE 9

OT - Moses - he was transformed by being in the presence of the Lord

NT – 2 Corinthians 3:18

But we all, with *unveiled* face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord.

We all, with **open face**, beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord. 2 Cor. 3:18.

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SLIDE 10 & 11 From this Utmost Devotional:

January 23rd

Transformed by insight

The outstanding characteristic of a Christian is this unveiled frankness before God so that the life becomes a mirror for other lives. By being filled with the Spirit we are transformed, and by beholding we become mirrors. You always know when a man has been beholding the glory of the Lord, you feel in your inner spirit that he is the mirror of the Lord's own character. Beware of anything which would sully that mirror in you; it is nearly always a good thing, the good that is not the best.

The golden rule for your life and mine is this concentrated keeping of the life open towards God. Let everything else—work, clothes, food, everything on earth go by the board, saving that one thing. The rush of other things always tends to obscure this concentration on God. We have to maintain ourselves in the place of beholding, keeping the life absolutely spiritual all through. Let other things come and go as they may, let other people criticize as they will, but never allow anything to obscure the life that is hid with Christ in God. Never be hurried out of the relationship of abiding in Him. It is the one thing that is apt to fluctuate but it ought not to. The severest discipline of a Christian's life is to learn how to keep "beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord."

Blackabee pg 90 **Praise** is rooted not in circumstance of the moment but in the nature and trustworthiness of God. Pg 390 Praise is the spontaneous response of a grateful child of God in His presence.

Ps 91:2: I will praise *You*, O LORD, with my whole heart; I will tell of all Your marvelous works. ² I will be glad and rejoice in You; I will sing praise to Your name, O Most High.



SLIDE 19

Ps 33:1-3 Rejoice in the LORD, O you righteous! For praise from the upright is beautiful. ² Praise the LORD with the harp; ^a Make melody to Him with an instrument of ten strings. ³ Sing to Him a new song; Play skillfully with a shout of joy.

PSALM 34:1-8 I will bless the LORD at all times; His praise *shall* continually *be* in my mouth. ² My soul shall make its boast in the LORD; The humble shall hear *of it* and be glad. ³ Oh, magnify the LORD with me, And let us exalt His name together.

⁴ I sought the LORD, and He heard me, And delivered me from all my fears.
⁵ They looked to Him and were radiant, And their faces were not ashamed.
⁶ This poor man cried out, and the LORD heard *him*, And saved him out of all his troubles.
⁷ The ^[a] angel of the LORD encamps all around those who fear Him, And delivers them.

⁸Oh, taste and see that the LORD *is* good; Blessed *is* the man *who* trusts in Him!
