¹⁰ God has revealed these things to us through the Spirit. The Spirit searches everything, including the depths of God. ¹¹ Who knows a person's depths except their own spirit that lives in them? In the same way, no one has known the depths of God except God's Spirit. ¹² We haven't received the world's spirit but God's Spirit so that we can know the things given to us by God.¹³ These are the things we are talking about—not with words taught by human wisdom but with words taught by the Spirit—we are interpreting spiritual things to spiritual people. ¹⁴ But people who are unspiritual don't accept the things from God's Spirit. They are foolishness to them and can't be understood, because they can only be comprehended in a spiritual way.¹⁵ Spiritual people comprehended by anyone.

Praise Worship Sacrifice

When they had come into a house, he asked them, "What were you arguing about during the journey?" ³⁴ They didn't respond, since on the way they had been debating with each other about who was the greatest.³⁵ He sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be least of all and the servant of all."³⁶ Jesus reached for a little child, placed him among the Twelve, and embraced him. Then he said, ³⁷ "Whoever welcomes one of these children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me isn't actually welcoming me but rather the one who sent me." CEB [WHERE IS SERVANT: welcoming =???? those who are children to us=???]

Mark 10:35-45 A request from James and John

³⁵ James and John, Zebedee's sons, came to Jesus and said, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask." ³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" He asked.

³⁷ They said, "Allow one of us to sit on your right and the other on your left when you enter your glory." ³⁸ Jesus replied, "You don't know what you're asking! Can you drink the cup I drink or receive the baptism I receive?" ³⁹ "We can," they answered.

Jesus said, "You will drink the cup I drink and receive the baptism I receive, ⁴⁰ but to sit at my right or left hand isn't mine to give. It belongs to those for whom it has been prepared." ⁴¹ Now when the other ten disciples heard about this, they became angry with James and John. ⁴² Jesus called them over and said, **"You know that the ones who are considered the rulers by the Gentiles show off their authority over them and their high-ranking officials order them around.** ⁴³ But that's not the way it will be with you. Whoever wants to be great among you will be your servant. ⁴⁴ Whoever wants to be first among you will be the slave of all, ⁴⁵ for the Son of Man/Human One didn't come to be served but rather to serve and to give his life to liberate many people." **CEB**

Washing Others Feet Service comes from?

[Our relationship with the Divine.... BUILDS community. Is birthed in HUMILITY. Surrenders our rights. Being available to be vulnerable.]

Small service = Looks like what?

[Done in secret a lot. Requires hearing from the Spirit. Hiddenness rebukes the flesh. Requires SUBMISSION.]

"If there is no element of asceticism (simplicity, self-denial) in our lives, if we give free rein to the desires of the flesh...we shall find it hard to train for the service of Christ." Bonhoeffer

TIME – Define waste of time. Small service redefines time. And strikes a blow to sloth and idleness. It refuses to gossip. Addresses conflict[doesn't let it stop it]. Refuses to slander(malign, defame, lie) others.

SERVE looks like:

To acknowledge others and affirm their worth. Listening. Bearing their burdens. Sharing His Word with them.

James 2:8 CEB

You do well when you really fulfill the royal law found in scripture, *Love your neighbor as yourself*.

He has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing that comes from heaven. ⁴ God chose us in Christ to be holy and blameless in God's presence before the creation of the world. ⁵ God destined us to be his adopted children through Jesus Christ because of his love. This was according to his goodwill and plan ⁶ and to honor his glorious grace that he has given to us freely through the Son whom he loves. ⁷ We have been ransomed through his Son's blood, and we have forgiveness for our failures based on his overflowing grace, ⁸ which he poured over us with wisdom and understanding. ⁹ God revealed his hidden designate to us, which is according to his goodwill and the plan that he intended to accomplish through his Son.¹⁰ This is what God planned for the climax of all times: to bring all things together in Christ, the things in heaven along with the things on earth. ¹¹ We have also received an inheritance in Christ. TOOK UPON HIM THE FORM OF A SERVANT Lesson 8 A SERVANT'S HEART Philippians 2:7

But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men.

In the past year I have done some substitute teaching in a local Christian school. Although I had taught third grade years ago, I was amazed that many things about them remain unchanged. One of the big consistencies was in the role of leadership. To the average third grader being line leader is still a position of great significance. Something about being first in line gives a child a feeling of accomplishment. (I guess I still feel that way as I occasionally am first in a checkout line that just opened.) This coveted position is a place of prestige and importance not to be taken lightly.

Something within each of us constantly tempts us to fight for our rights and privileges. We desire to be recognized and served in ways that pamper our egos and feed our self-awareness. Yet, as we consider the life of the Lord Jesus, we realize that His interaction with the people around Him was in direct opposition to this self-centered philosophy. In His coming to earth, He not only laid aside all position and honor but also became a man of self-sacrificing service. Let's study some passages to see how His approach to service manifested itself.

As a Little Child

On several occasions Jesus taught His disciples the meaning of service. He continually had to refocus the disciples' attentions, as they were prone to desire the status and recognition as the "Best Disciple" or "Most Likely to Succeed."

His twelve closest followers often argued among themselves about who was worthy of the positions closest to Jesus. Jesus used these occasions to challenge them to have His heart—the heart of a servant.

As He That Serveth

Time in the Word: Read Mark 10:32–45.

In Mark 10:32–34, Jesus spoke again to His disciples about the events that were soon to come. He wanted them to be ready for the unfolding of redemption's plan, yet the disciples seemed to find the predictions of the coming days unsettling. They struggled for some definite security for their futures. Two brothers, James and John, asked Jesus for special positions in His future glory. They wanted to sit one on His right hand and the other on His left. According to Matthew 20:20–21, they even had their mother, Salome, ask the Lord for these special seats of honor.

Look again at the passage in Mark and consider the response these brothers received from Jesus and the other disciples.

Another passage in Luke tells of the Lord Jesus' challenge to His disciples in this area of service. Again there was a rivalry among the disciples about who should be considered great.

And there was also a strife among them, which of them should be accounted the greatest. And he said unto them, The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and they that exercise authority upon them are called benefactors. But ye shall not be so: but he that is greatest among you, let him be as the younger; and he that is chief, as he that doth serve. For whether is greater, he that sitteth at meat, or he that serveth? is not he that sitteth at meat? but I am among you as he that serveth. (**Luke 22:24–27**)

The Gentile kings would "rule with an iron hand, and then take a title that extolled their benevolence." Jesus told His followers that they should do neither. He declared that the one who is greatest is the one who considers himself as the younger, and the one who is the leader is the one who serves others. To illustrate His point even further, Jesus used a common scenario of their day. He asked who is greater—the one at the table to be served or the one serving? He answered His own question—the one being served. Then He proclaimed His surrendered heart—

I am among you as he that serves.

As an Attitude of His Heart

Jesus was humble and submissive to the will of the Father. He had not come to be exalted as King at this time. He came with the attitude of a perfect servant to minister to a lost and dying world. His love for mankind was not disingenuous but saturated with a godly love for lost mankind. He came as Savior knowing He would return as Lord and King.

Am I hurt when people don't acknowledge what I've done?

Am I not interested in helping if I have to work under someone else's leadership?

Do I want to share the task or ministry with anyone else?

Do I get irritated when someone else is asked to do something that I feel I can do better?

Do I hesitate to take a task if no one will know that I'm the one who did it?

Carefully consider the words of the following poem. May it be the prayer of your heart today!

Servant's Heart

Make me a servant like You, dear Lord, Living for others each day: Humble and meek, helping the weak, Loving in all that I say. Make me a witness like You, dear Lord, Showing the love of the cross-Sharing Your Word till all have heard, Serving whatever the cost. Give me, Lord, a servant's heart. Here's my life; take ev'ry part. Give me, Lord, a servant's heart. Help me draw so close to You That Your love comes shining through. Give me, Lord, a servant's heart. Give me, Lord, a servant's heart. -Ron Hamilton¹

Lesson 5 A Servant's Heart

What did you want to be when you grew up? Most likely, your ambition was not to become a slave. Even now, you'd probably rather have a maid than be one! But the Bible summons you to servanthood. The goal of every Christian ought to be the same as Jesus Christ's—"not to be ministered unto, but to minister" (Matthew 20:28).

It's usually not fun to serve. Normally it's just plain old hard work, a discipline of obedience. But serving God and others from the heart with godly motives brings joy and blessings unique to those who serve. Even if you didn't grow up to be what you'd planned to be, it's not too late to pursue the greatest vocation of all—a servant!

Only fear the Lord, and serve him in truth with all your heart: for consider how great things he hath done for you. (1 Samuel 12:24)

WHOM DO YOU SERVE?

1. In the following verses, underline whom you serve.

Not with eyeservice, as menpleasers; but as the servants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart. (*Ephesians 6:6*)

Serve the Lord with fear, and rejoice with trembling. (Psalm 2:11)

Now therefore fear the Lord, and serve him in sincerity and in truth: and put away the gods which your fathers served on the other side of the flood, and in Egypt; and serve ye the Lord. (Joshua 24:14)

How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? (Hebrews 9:14)

2. List some ways you are presently serving the Lord.

Look at your list. Do you see that serving the Lord always requires serving people? You can worship the Lord alone, but you cannot serve Him in solitude.

SERVING THE LORD = SERVING PEOPLE

Serving the servants of the Lord

After the Lord gave the child Samuel to Hannah, she "lent him to the Lord" to be His lifelong servant. Samuel went to live at the temple with Eli, the high priest. First Samuel 2:11 says that this boy, around age twelve, "did minister unto [serve; wait on] the Lord before Eli the priest."

3. What services did he perform for Eli (1 Samuel 3:3–6, 15)?

These were simple, practical acts, but in doing them, Samuel was serving the Lord.

4. Read Luke 8:1–3. What were Jesus and His disciples doing?

What women were traveling with them?

What needs did they meet with their own resources?

This was the first ladies' missionary society!

Serving the saints of the Lord



The early church honored and financially supported older widows who had no other resources if they were devoted to serving the Lord and the church.

5. List the good works these women did (1 Timothy 5:10).

These are all unglamorous, private acts of ministry to others, but they were done as service to the Lord.

6. Dorcas was a servant to the church (Acts 9:36–39) who met the needs of the poor. Verse 36 says she was "full of and ."

Specifically, what had she done and for whom?

What tools, then, did she use to serve the Lord?

7. Read the account of the judgment of the Gentiles in Matthew 25:34–40. What principle is being taught?

As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. (Galatians 6:10)

The opportunity to do good works = the obligation to do good works—to everyone, but especially to whom? Who is that?

For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister. (Hebrews 6:10)

The ministry of those who served the saints (poor, persecuted church members) is described here as a "work and labour [wearying, painful toil] of love," done in the name of God.

- 8. In contrast, what does 1 John 3:17 say about a Christian who does not meet the physical needs of other believers?
- 9. Read Romans 12:13, 1 Peter 4:9, and Hebrews 13:2. What is one practical way to love and serve?

When you do this, what tools are you using to serve the Lord?

How Do You Serve?

Only fear the Lord, and serve him in truth with all your heart: for consider how great things he hath done for you. (1 Samuel 12:24)



- 10. How do you recognize service that's done from the heart? What does service that's not from the heart look like? (Remember the Bible definition of *heart*—your emotional, mental, and spiritual self.)
- 11. According to this verse, what should you keep in mind as you serve?
- 12. What emotions should accompany your service (Psalm 100:2; Romans 12:11)?

What "great things" has God done for you? Have you been serving Him grudgingly, motivated by guilt and obligation, or in jubilant response to His blessings?

Your physical body is your tool for service. Though you love and worship God spiritually, service always involves action.

- 13. Every woman is allowed to choose whose servant she will be. Read Romans 6:13–23 and give the two options you have—and their outcomes. (Your "members" are your body parts.)
- 14. Your choice of whom you serve with your body stems from a spiritual decision you have made (or not made). What surrender does Romans 12:1 beg you to make?
- 15. Read 1 Corinthians 6:19–20. What amazing truth about the Holy Spirit is taught in verse 19?

Therefore, you are not .

So, what is your obligation?

16. How have you used your body to serve others this week? If you are not using your body to serve others, what does that say about your spirit?

WHY DO YOU SERVE?

Every Christian has received at least one spiritual gift. You (yes, you!) have something special to contribute to the body of Christ.

But unto every one of us is given grace according to the measure of the gift of Christ. (Ephesians 4:7)

But every man hath his proper gift of God, one after this manner, and another after that. (1 Corinthians 7:7)

But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. (1 Corinthians 12:7)



But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will. (1 Corinthians 12:11)

- 17. Ephesians 4:12–16 tells how the body of Christ will gain when believers exercise their spiritual gifts. List those benefits.
- 18. According to 1 Corinthians 13:1–3, what one trait is absolutely essential if any spiritual gift is to benefit others?

Love is always focused on others, not on self. You don't receive a spiritual gift so that you can be proud of it or enjoy it by yourself but so that you can use it to serve the church.

19. Romans 12:3–10 compares the body of believers to a physical body, in which all members (all parts) have been gifted for their office (the role they are to play).

Where did your gift come from (verse 3)?

How should that affect your attitude toward your gift?

Do we all have the same gifts (verses 4, 6)?

What is our relationship to Christ and to each other (verse 5)?

What seven spiritual gifts are named (verses 6–8)?

With what kind of love are you to serve (verse 9*a*)?

In what practical way do you show love (verse 10)?

Notice how all these ways of serving are focused on people. Do you recognize any of these gifts as yours? Are you using them?

My husband and I were visiting in the home of a couple who had been members of our church. Explaining why they had recently decided to join another, much larger church, the wife said, "Well, it's just like shopping. If K-Mart doesn't have what you want, you go to Wal-Mart instead."

Based on what you have just learned, what's wrong with that sort of consumer mentality toward the local church? Is it biblical for a Christian to choose a church based on what it offers her? Or does she have other obligations to the body?



First Corinthians 12 gives another comparison of the body of Christ with a physical body.

20. Why did the Lord make His children (the parts of His body) different from each other (verses 14–20)?

Is any member of the body unimportant, unnecessary, insignificant, or inferior? Explain (verses 21–24).

Instead of being divided, how should we respond to each other (verses 25–26)?

We serve each other in the body by recognizing the value of every person's spiritual gift and by sharing joys and giving emotional support in trials. Don't fret about identifying your spiritual gift. Just tell the Lord you will serve Him by serving others and then watch for doors to open. Walk through them, and you'll soon sense what you do best.

Peter sums up our topic in 1 Peter 4:10–11. He says that you are to minister to others the gift you have received, because you are simply the steward, not the owner, of your gift.

21. If you have a speaking gift, how are you to speak?

If you have a serving gift, how are you to serve?

What's your ultimate goal for using your gift?

Ruth serves the Lord by playing the piano and teaching children in her church in spite of crippling arthritis and other painful ailments. When I asked her how she does it, she answered, "I don't know. I just know that I'm supposed to serve the Lord and that when I try, He helps me. Every time I play the piano, He gets the glory, because everybody knows I can't play with hands like these!"

22. What was Isaiah's honest appraisal of himself (Isaiah 6:5-8)?

What did God do for Isaiah?

What was Isaiah's immediate response?

Simon the Pharisee thought he was righteous, but he omitted some simple acts of service to Jesus (Luke 7:36–48).

23. What were they (verses 44–46)?



Why did the sinful woman do much more (verse 47)?

According to Jesus, who will love and serve the Lord most?

Jesus Christ came to earth as a servant, not as a King; as a man, not in His glory as God.

24. Read Philippians 2:5-8. What was Jesus' ultimate act of service?

Even before His death, He set an example of servanthood. Read John 13:3–15.

25. What simple, humble service did He do for His disciples?

Why did He do that? Was it just because their feet were dirty?

What example was He setting for His disciples (and you)?

In Mark 10:35–45. Jesus' disciples were competing for dominance in His kingdom. Jesus told them, "Whosoever will be great among you, shall be your minister: and whosoever of you will be the chiefest, shall be servant of all."

If you were asked to serve in a president's cabinet, you'd be honored. But you have an infinitely greater privilege—to serve the King of Kings! You serve Him by serving His people. God makes a promise to you, His servant, in Hebrews 6:10: "God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love."

But I am among you as he that serveth. (Luke 22:27)

"Once we realize that Jesus has served us even to the depths of our meagerness, our selfishness, and our sin, nothing we encounter from others will be able to exhaust our determination to serve others for His sake." (Oswald Chambers)²

⁴⁵ ^(a) "Who then is a faithful and wise servant, whom his master made ruler over his household, to give them food ^(a) in due season? ⁴⁶ ^(a)Blessed *is* that servant whom his master, when he comes, will find so doing. ⁴⁷ Assuredly, I say to you that ^(a)he will make him ruler over all his goods. ⁴⁸ But if that evil servant says in his heart, 'My master ^(a) is delaying ^(a)his coming,' ⁴⁹ and begins to beat *his* fellow servants, and to eat and drink with the drunkards, ⁵⁰ the master of that servant will come on a day when he is not looking for *him* and at an hour that he is ^(a) not aware of, ⁵¹ and will cut him in two and appoint *him* his portion with the hypocrites. ^(a)There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Matthew 25

The Parable of the Talents^(K)

¹⁴ "For *the kingdom of heaven is* wlike a man traveling to a far country, *who* called his own servants and delivered his goods to them. ¹⁵ And to one he gave five talents, to another two, and to another one, wto each according to his own ability; and immediately he went on a journey. ¹⁶ Then he who had received the five talents went and traded with them, and made another five talents. ¹⁷ And likewise he who *had received* two gained two more also. ¹⁸ But he who had received one went and dug in the ground, and hid his lord's money. ¹⁹ After a long time the lord of those servants came and settled accounts with them.

²⁰ "So he who had received five talents came and brought five other talents, saying, 'Lord, you delivered to me five talents; look, I have gained five more talents besides them.' ²¹ His lord said to him, 'Well *done*, good and faithful servant; you were@faithful over a few things, @I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into @the joy of your lord.' ²² He also who had received two talents came and said, 'Lord, you delivered to me two talents; look, I have gained two more talents besides them.'²³ His lord said to him, @'Well *done*, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into @the joy of your lord.'

²⁴ "Then he who had received the one talent came and said, 'Lord, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you have not sown, and gathering where you have not scattered seed. ²⁵ And I was afraid, and went and hid your talent in the ground. Look, *there* you have *what is* yours.'

²⁶ "But his lord answered and said to him, 'You [®]wicked and lazy servant, you knew that I reap where I have not sown, and gather where I have not scattered seed. ²⁷ So you ought to have deposited my money with the bankers, and at my coming I would have received back my own with interest. ²⁸ So take the talent from him, and give *it* to him who has ten talents.



²⁹ "'For to everyone who has, more will be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who does not have, even what he has will be taken away. ³⁰ And cast the unprofitable servant into the outer darkness. "There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

2 KINGS 4:8

The woman's gracious provision for the Lord's prophet resulted in the coming of a precious son into her life (see Prov. 11:25). Though some consider namelessness as merely the absence of power, we see in this humble woman the reward for a servant's heart—power with God and gratitude from His prophet. Her inward beauty (servant's heart) prompted outward duty (hospitality); **Elisha's inward virtue** (gratitude) unfolded in outward deeds (gift of a son). The Shunammite's unsolicited hospitality awakened Elisha's thoughtful gratitude. Her pro-active faith and confident determination in the midst of grief resulted in the restoration of her son's life.

PRAISE — an act of worship or acknowledgment by which the virtues or deeds of another are recognized and extolled. The praise of one human being toward another, although often beneficial (1 Cor. 11:2; 1 Peter 2:14), can be a snare (Prov. 27:21; Matt. 6:1–5). But the praise of God toward people is the highest commendation they can receive. Such an act of praise reflects a true servant's heart (Matt. 25:21; 1 Cor. 4:5; Eph. 1:3–14).

Our praise toward God is the means by which we express our joy to the Lord. We are to praise God both for who He is and for what He does (Ps. 150:2). Praising God for who He is called adoration; praising Him for what He does is known as thanksgiving. Praise of God may be in song or prayer, individually or collectively, spontaneous or prearranged, originating from the emotions or from the will.

The godly person will echo David's words, "My praise shall be continually of You . . . And [I] will praise You yet more and more" (Ps. 71:6, 14).⁴
